Structure and contents

The **public seminar on automatic recognition** will explore the topic in a multi-faceted way, starting with an overview on the issue from the [2022 Monitoring Report on the implementation of the Lisbon Recognition Convention](#), the [2018 Council Recommendation on promoting automatic mutual recognition](#) and the [2023 Report on its implementation](#).

Thereafter, the seminar will take a **practical approach**, presenting different models of automatic recognition and the tools available to support its implementation. To do so, some legally and not legally binding ways of framing automatic recognition will be considered, together with examples of tools towards the application of *de facto* automatic recognition. Furthermore, the topics of information provision and digitalisation will be presented as transversal solutions to support automatic recognition.

The **last part** of the seminar will be entirely devoted to the **discussion among participants** on automatic recognition.

The seminar is targeted to higher education institutions and all relevant stakeholders involved in recognition processes.
