Main goals	<p>Develop an <b>EHEA action plan on Internationalisation and Mobility</b>, considering the experience of the 2012 action plan adopted at the Bucharest Ministerial Conference, that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Supports the EHEA members in developing and implementing <b>internationalisation policies</b> that enable all learners to acquire international and intercultural competencies.</li> <li>➤ Fosters a <b>discussion of EHEA mobility targets</b> in light of greatly varying mobility numbers in different countries, between credit and degree mobility and different cycles, and <b>identify the barriers to mobility</b> as well as <b>offering recommendations for the removal</b> of these barriers.</li> <li>➤ <b>Provide concrete recommendations</b> for member countries to develop or enhance policies that collectively strive for <b>1) more inclusive, 2) more balanced, and 3) greener mobility</b>.</li> <li>➤ <b>Includes a glossary</b> of the key terms in the area of internationalisation and mobility, to ensure common understanding of terminology.</li> </ul>
Outcomes	<p>The WG will deliver an EHEA Action Plan for internationalisation and mobility, to be submitted for approval to the BFUG and adopted by the Ministerial Conference in 2027.</p>
